# May 6 Program Masha Turchinsky "Flowing Rivers, Starry Skies and Kindred Worlds: A Hudson River Museum Overview"

In 2020, The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation recognized the Hudson River Museum in Yonkers with an Art Museum Futures Fund for "visionary leadership, distinctive collections, and commitment to community, as well as historically overlooked artists and histories."

CEO since 2017, Masha Turchinsky directed HRM's \$14 million capital projects, including the new West Wing opened in 2023. Prior to her HRM appointment, Ms. Turchinsky worked for 19 years at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. As a consultant, she currently serves on the national Board of Directors of ArtTable, dedicated to advancing the leadership of women in the arts.

She holds an Ed.M. in International Educational Development from Columbia Teachers College, an MA in Education from NYU, and a BS in Russian from Georgetown.
